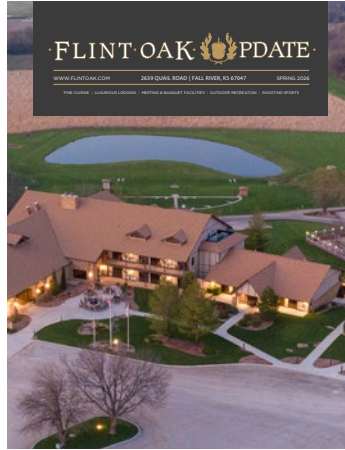

# PRESERVE NEWS 2026

Guides are getting their blaze orange cleaned up and put away for the season. While we are all enjoying the luxury of getting to sleep in a little and for things to slow down, there is still plenty of work that needs to get done. We celebrate the end of hunting season by getting our fields burned and prepped for the next season. In gaps in spring rains, we will be busy planting milo and deer food plots in preparation for the upcoming season.

Fishing is firing off here at the ranch, with that we will be stocking more fish this spring. Fishing areas and boat will get a good detailing and ready for anglers to come get their lines stretched. Last year, we cleaned out a bunch of trees that died at the marina area and still have a few more to get to this summer after the last several years of drought. We will also be looking into getting some new boats purchased for Center Lake.

Preserve staff will be busy building new fence along the south end of the property this spring. We've recently done some dirt work and some tree clearing to get some new fence lines put in. Along with building new fence, staff will also be busy working on roads. Heavy rains always bring areas needing attention. This offseason we will also be doing some tree clearing around the ranch to open areas that have grown in over the years, expanding some hunting areas and allowing more grass to grow up that has been shaded out. Last year, we contracted a local drone aerial sprayer to come to the ranch and hit some hard-to-get areas of the property where traditional equipment cannot reach. We plan to continue doing this in the years going forward to reduce nuisance species.

## FUTURE KENNEL OF FLINT OAK

Whoop, Whoa, Easy, Dead, Fetch it up. These are just a few of the words you have heard your guide say to one or both of his high-class Flint Oak dogs on a hunt. But they don't start hearing that in the field, no they start getting introduced to those words at a young age during the training program that each and every one of the valuable dogs has to go through to become a member of the prestigious Flint Oak kennel.

Last spring the staff bred two litters, one being a litter of German short-hairs and the other being pointers. The short-hair litter is out of "Flint Oaks Kate," a wonderful white and liver dog who was bred to an outside source. In that litter, there are six females, two of which are white and liver, the other four are black and white. The staff is excited to get to work with them over the summer to get the absolute best out of them for the upcoming season. The litter of pointers, who are out of "Flint Oaks Lilly" has two pups in it, one male and one female. Both pups are beautiful liver and white dogs, who have shown some extreme drive.

This winter the staff has also set up the future breeding program with three litters of pointers bred. First was "Flint Oaks Ann," who is a beautiful black and white dog. The second being "Flint Oaks Lexi," a high octane and stunning orange and white dog. The third being "Flint Oaks Beth," a small but mighty liver and white dog who has a ton of heart. Those three litters are expected to arrive this spring and the staff will begin the socialization and early bio-sensor program. Both programs are key

programs to get the puppies off to a great start once they enter the training program.

Kennel employee, Devyn again attended a few field trials this winter with his stud "Ringo." All be it, not as many as the past but enough that the two-man team were able to qualify for the "National Bird Dog Challenge" national championship held in Palmer, Kansas. Along with the qualification, "Ringo" also earned his second pointing division title making him an amateur pointing champion as well as open pointing champion. With both of "Ringo's" accolades, he is also in the prestigious "Dog of the Year" run off held at the beginning of the week of nationals.

The Flint Oak staff wish them the best of luck as they attempt to bring home both the dog of the year title as well as the national championship. As always, the hard-working staff is going to work all summer to make sure that all the dogs are prepared and in the best shape they can be for the upcoming season, which is just a few short months away.

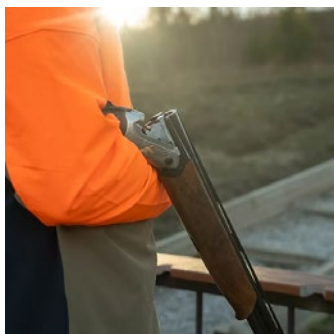

One of Flint Oak's signature competitions returns for its 24th year—three days of world-class shooting, great food, and even better stories.

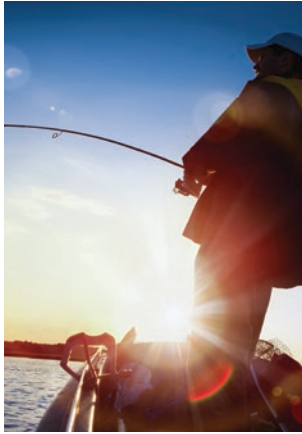

There is no better time to get outdoors and go fishing than right now! With mild temperatures and active fish, the coming weeks could provide some of the best fishing of the season at Flint Oak. Water temperatures are slowly rising, which

triggers increased feeding activity among many species. Fishing has picked up along the rocky banks and near submerged timber. This time of year many baits will produce good numbers of fish. Spinnerbaits, chatterbaits, shallow running crankbaits, and rattle traps can be a good way to pick up a lot of bites and cover water. If the fish are a little more finicky, pick up a jig and craw style bait, or a dropshot can be a great producer as well in the early springtime of year.

All during the fishing season, we run fish feeders in all three lakes. On top of that, we stock all three lakes with shad, bluegill, and tilapia. With this smorgasbord of available bait, these fish are chasing like crazy and putting on the pounds. They essentially have their own "Flint Oak Buffet" in the lake. While all three lakes are managed for bass and wipers, there is opportunity to catch bluegill and crappie.

Center Lake is located the closest to the lodge (just over the hill from the water tower). This lake is free for our members to fish anytime (with a reservation). You will be assigned a beach for the whole day, and you are welcome to come and go as you please. For \$60 + tax, you can rent a two-person boat for the day to get out on the water. This lake is known for its deep clear water, with several steep rock bluffs. As the temperatures warm, the grass beds will start growing in the lake providing good ambush points for the predatory fish.

Indian Lake is in the center of the ranch. This is our largest lake that has a marina dock. This lake is only available to fish with a guide, in a three-hour window. Much like our hunts, you will pick a three-hour window, and the guide will be there to meet you at the lodge with a cooler of some refreshments. You are welcome to bring your own gear and tackle, but the guide will have all the gear and tackle to put you on the fish. This lake is known for its big flooded timber and rocky banks.

The third lake is West Lake which is located on the west side of the property. This lake is booked in half day increments, but you can double book it for a full day. Upon reservation a 17' boat will be dropped off the dock for you and your fishing partner to take out on the water with a foot controlled trolling motor. This lake is known for its grass beds and good numbers of bass and big wipers.

Dust off the fishing poles, get them strung up with some fresh line, and give Flint Oak a call to get that line stretched!

## DEER SEASON 2026

---

With spring upon us, we have been continuing our deer protein feeding program. We started this in February with colder weather to give deer plenty of availability and access to food. We have been doing this over the course of the last 5-6 years now. We

switch over from corn to protein in February and continue feeding protein till the first part of September when the deer annually shed their velvet. At this point, we switch back to feeding corn.

In years past, we have had a few food plots set up for deer. In the last couple years, we have planted a few more. Recently, with drought conditions, we have just been planting wheat and have been lucky to time what little rain we have had and get it in with good showers coming. This spring, we will be looking into planting some corn and soybeans in some of our bigger food plots. This will provide a better food source to help the deer though the harsher months. The smaller plots will remain in wheat.

This last season, we purchased four more new redneck 6x6 blinds. This takes us to 8 redneck blinds now, and 14 total rifle blinds. We will continue to purchase a few newer blinds in the future to keep the comfort level to an all-time

high! These blinds are as nice as they come, and when the weather gets nasty, you can still hunt in comfort so you don't potentially miss that buck of a lifetime!

We have recently cut back on the number of deer hunters we are taking each season, giving preference to returning hunters and any other available spots on a first come first serve basis. Flint Oak did so to try to make sure we are harvesting mature deer. In return, this should also lead to hunters seeing larger antlered deer and increase the chance of harvesting a buck of a lifetime. As populations/age class of deer varies, we will fluctuate the number of hunters. As we lease more quality property, we may be able to bump the number of hunters we are able to accommodate as well.





# SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

Each year incoming students to the K-State Wildlife and Outdoor Enterprise Management (WOEM) program have the opportunity to apply for a scholarship given by Flint Oak.

This is the 16th year these awards have been available, with the recipient chosen based on their submitted essays. In 2018, the Trevor McCoy scholarship was implemented by the late Flint Oak Member Kevin McCoy, in memory of his son. Flint Oak was asked to select one of our applicants to receive this scholarship for \$2500.00.

Flint Oak would like to congratulate the 2025 award winners. Abraham Noll was this year's Trevor McCoy Scholarship recipient as well as five others who will receive the Flint Oak Scholarship.



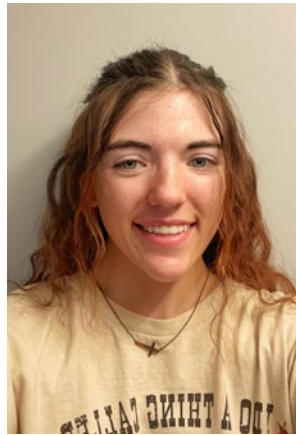
## ABRAHAM NOLL

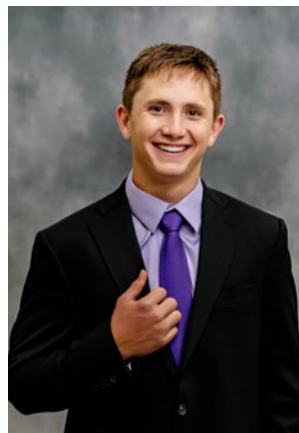
## ANNA RICKER

# FLINT OAK'S ANNUAL HUNTER EDUCATION

With the help of the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism and our local conservation officer, Flint Oak will conduct the 44th annual Hunter Education course on August 8 and 9, 2026. This course consists of outdoor hands-on instruction that allows students to become more involved in the learning process. During these sessions, students will be taught history of firearms, firearms basics, ammunition, basic gun safety, hunter responsibility, ethics, and fair chase, field safety, and bow hunting. Included are lessons on conservation and wildlife management, wildlife of Kansas, outdoor emergencies, Kansas hunting regulations, and boating safety for hunters. The course will run all day on Saturday and half a day on Sunday. After completing the session work, the students will be given a box of shells if they would like to "PRACTICE" what they have learned at Flint Oak's 5-Star rated Sporting Clay Course on Sunday afternoon.

The age requirement to become certified in hunter education is 11 years of age. The hunter education course may be taken by those under the age of 11 on a space available basis, although they will be required to take it again upon reaching the age of 11. The course is free and everyone is encouraged to take it even if not required by law.

Remember, anyone born on or after July 1, 1957 must be certified by an approved course in hunter education before they can hunt in Kansas with the exception of anyone 15 years old and under may hunt without hunter



education certification provided that they are under the direct supervision of an adult 18 years old or older who has completed a hunter education course. A one-time deferral of the Hunter Education requirements may be acquired by individuals 16 and older by purchasing an Apprentice hunting license. Holders of Apprentice hunting licenses must hunt under the supervision of a licensed hunter age 18 or older. Under Kansas Law, Hunter Education Certification issued by any state, Canadian Province, and some foreign jurisdictions are also deemed to meet the Hunter Education requirements.

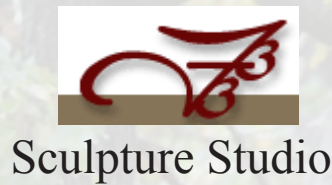

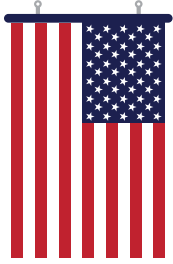

## INDIVIDUAL AND CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP BY-LAWS

### INDIVIDUAL (Single designee)

Individual Memberships shall be issued in the name of an individual or in the name of a business or firm. Individual Memberships are assigned to one (1) designated individual and are non-transferable. The designee of an Individual Membership will be responsible for any charges incurred by his guests.

### CORPORATE (Multiple designees)

Corporate Memberships shall be issued either in the name of a company or an individual associate of a professional group. A company is understood to be any entity holding a Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN). Such named entity (whether a company or an individual associate) shall be designated as the Owner of the Membership, and the rights and privileges of the Membership are the property of the named Owner. The first Designee appointed by the Owner of the Membership shall be responsible for and billed for all charges incurred by designees and their guests. Corporate Memberships include membership rights and privileges for three (3) designated individuals. The first Designee shall be Flint Oak's contact for billing purposes. All designees must be directly employed by said company or an associate of the same firm as the Owner of the Membership. Designees may be changed at no charge provided the Owner of the Membership notifies Flint Oak in writing of the substitution.

### JUNIOR (Single designee)

Junior Memberships, for those between the ages of twenty-one and forty, require current Hunt Member sponsorship, are assigned to one (1) designated individual and are non-transferable. The designee of a Junior Membership will be responsible for any charges incurred by his guests.

### SENIOR (Single designee)

Senior Memberships are available to our current members, who have been a member for the previous five years and are 70 years of age or older. Membership is assigned to one (1) designated individual and is non-transferable. The designee of a Senior Membership will be responsible for any charges incurred by his guests.

### Dues and Charges

1. Membership dues, regardless of Membership type, shall be paid in advance. Hunt Membership dues will establish membership for one year from the date of acceptance.
2. All monthly charges will be due the tenth of the month following the month such charges were incurred.
3. Members will be responsible for any charges and/or damages incurred by their guests. Guests will have no billing privileges.
4. Members will be billed monthly. Payments to be made by check or ACH payments (no credit cards).
5. Corporate Membership billings will be to one designated Member and will not be broken down to individual designee charges.
6. Hunt credits and/or services included with the initial membership fee must be used during the months of membership. They do not carry over to another membership year, nor are such unused services subject to refund at the conclusion of the membership. Social Memberships receive no hunt credits.

On a Corporate Membership, the first Designee or his assigned should collect and forward any monies paid in order to keep the account accurate. Flint Oak will consider the corporate membership as one account and cannot credit individuals in that account as well as assign hunt credits to individuals in that account. All monies received will be applied to earliest invoices.

The Corporate Membership rate is extended due to the reduction in bookkeeping on one account rather than three individual accounts.

# IMPORTANT REMINDERS

## FISHING REMINDERS

Fishing is April 1st through October 31st. Catch and release only for Bass and Wipers. See fishing rules. During these months fishing for overnight guests and Social Members is at Center Lake, Duck Pond, along the creek and Lodge Lake from the silo to the windsock. Indian Lake is not included. During the month of September, fishing lakes may be booked as long as no European or Field Hunts are scheduled in the vicinity. During fishing season, Flint Oak rental boats are permitted on Center Lake. No boats are allowed on Lodge Lake or Timber Lake due to the shot fall from Sporting Clays. We are very concerned about contamination of our water by zebra mussels or other invasive species. Under no circumstances will boats not owned by Flint Oak be allowed on any of the lakes or the creek. No waders allowed. Artificial bait only in the lakes, barbless hooks required.

## GUIDED FISHING CANCELLATIONS

Guided fishing cancellations received eight (8) days in advance, no charge; canceled seven (7) days or less \$125 per boat reserved.

## SUMMER RESERVATIONS AND CANCELLATIONS

All activities at Flint Oak require ADVANCE RESERVATIONS. We limit the reservations we accept to the personnel and facilities we have available. Unlike the airlines, WE DO NOT OVERBOOK! If we accept your reservation, we guarantee that we will have everything required for your activities (just like buying a ticket to a ballgame). We are located "deep in the country" and do not have passer-by business. Our food orders and personnel schedules are made weekly and must be based on advance reservations. Once your reservation is booked, we incur the expense of whatever advance ordering and planning are required. So if you fail to come, or cancel after the expense of preparations has been incurred, what is fair? Should all guests be penalized by increased charges to cover these expenses? Most of our guests believe it is fairer to charge a cancellation fee to those who create the increased cost!

## ROOM CANCELLATIONS

Room (meeting or lodging) reservations made for NON-HUNT/FISHING RELATED activities require a first-day deposit per room for non-members to guarantee reservations. Rooms may be canceled at NO CHARGE twenty-four (24) hours in advance. Cancellations twenty-four (24) hours or less will be charged the full amount per room per day reserved unless other arrangements have been made in writing by management.
