Preserve News

Hunting season is winding down for us here at the ranch. As we start to put away our hunting gear, we start to pull out our fire trucks in preparation for the spring prescribed burning. Every year we burn off more than 3,000 acres in less than two-weeks' time. We always start with burning off our bordering zones then start in towards the middle of the ranch depending on the forecasted wind direction. It takes all hands-on deck to get all the fields burnt before the green growth starts to emerge.

The grass is already turning green on us has the preserve staff sharping those mower blades to tackle the large task of keeping the ranch mowed up and looking sharp. Our mowing staff mows all day, everyday to keep the landscaping under control. With some new dirt work that has been done last fall and early this spring we will be working hard to prep them for getting some growth on them as well. Provided we get the adequate rainfall we need, the Preserve staff will be replanting all the deer and bird food plots, as well as adding in some new ones. This past deer season we saw some great success on some of these new and improved areas.

Now that summer is upon us and all the deer have shed their antlers it is time for the preserve crew to head to the feeders with flat beds loaded down with protein. As soon as bucks lose their racks they almost immediately start the regrowing process. When this takes place we want them to start eating the protein as soon as possible to put as much growth on as possible. This is our third full season of feeding protein

It is time to put the hunt season blues behind us. The miles you put on your gear is nowhere near the feeling of when you have to put it away for the summer. What is the solution to post

hunt season depression? It's a fishing pole. Go dig it out and get ready to put it to use.

Like most of the state last spring we still saw a decrease in the overall turkey population. However this fall we have seen more turkeys across the Ranch than we have in guite a while, with high hopes of their being some more birds around this spring. While the birds in the fall and winter were in larger flocks

than what you see during the spring time of year, there were birds on trail cameras in places we've never seen them before. making us think there might have been a better hatch last spring. The decrease in the turkey population has left a lot of people wondering "what happened to them all, they used to be everywhere?" While there were a lot of rumors going around.

there are several contributing factors to why the population took a downturn. Arguably one of the biggest challenges in our area for the birds was all of the heavy spring rains we have had in the last few years. These gully washers not only can flood out the nest that the hen turkey lays but it also changes the the water early, take a midday break and experience a hearty lunch at the Lodge, then go spend the rest of the afternoon ripping lips. Whether you're looking for a largemouth of a lifetime, an aggressive pole-bending wiper, or just looking to entertain your kids with a mess of perch, we have just what you are looking for.

Don't wait too long to plan your next trip to Flint Oak, the summer will go by far too fast. When booking, think heavily about booking a fishing trip. It will be a memory that will last a lifetime, and it may be a hobby you never knew you'd fall in love with. Remember, a bad day of fishing beats a good day at work.



habitat in areas where hens look to build nests at. This last spring was drier than normal which helped with have a better hatch than what we have had in the last few years. Predation is another big factor when it comes to raising little ones. With more opossums and raccoons running around than ever. it is hard not only for the eggs to not get eaten but also for the young birds to survive. It is well over a week after being hatched before a baby turkey can fly short distances, which means they are trying to escape predators on the ground until then. Bobcats and coyotes take a heavy toll on them during this time.

We are all looking forward to hearing that first owl hoot and the thundering gobble of a spring turkey immediately following. We are still keeping the number of hunters to a minimum this spring in hopes to let the turkey populations bounce back to greater numbers.

Deer Season 2022

We had a fantastic deer season out at the Ranch last fall. With 10 hunters out looking to fill a tag, all 10 hunters had opportunities to harvest great bucks. We started the season off in the early muzzleloader season with a guest from Oklahoma wrapping his tag around a beautiful full velvet main frame 9 point with a unique kicker off of his g2. His first Kansas whitetail, first whitetail with a muzzleloader, and first velvet buck, checking off multiple "first" on a fantastic early season hunt.

Moving on to archery season this year we only had one bow hunter with a completely booked solid rifle season coming up. A member out of Florida set out after one of our Flint Oak giants. The buck came by him the very first morning just before legal shooting hours and ended in having to let the buck walk. Later on an evening hunt the buck stepped back out into the food plot coming in facing head on without a shot opportunity. Some does slipped in behind the stand (downwind) and started getting a little nervous. This caused the buck to get nervous as well making him work his way off the food plot. With hopes of seeing the buck again that evening at an all time low, to his amazement the buck stepped back out a second time once again coming in head on without presenting an ethical shot. The buck still knew something wasn't guite right and made his way off the food plot. To his sheer disbelief, the



buck stepped back out on the food plot a third time once again not presenting an ethical shot. "I was shaking so bad that I'm not sure I could have gotten my bow pulled back even if he did present a shot. It was incredible to see a 280+ pound buck sporting 170+" rack at 20 yards." While the buck never presented at shot what an incredible time spent in the stand and a memory of a buck that will not soon be forgotten.

For rifle season we had seven different hunters from five different states hit the woods. The first hunter on the board was Charlie harvesting an old beautiful perfectly symmetrical 12 pointer. A deer well known amongst the Flint Oak staff as he was a buck we have been watching grow for over the

past four years. This buck tipped the scales at over 260 pounds and was estimated to be a six plus year old deer. Having a shed antler off the buck from the year prior made for one heck of a trophy.

The next honorable mention buck goes out to the Norris Family. The family of three all set out to wrap their tags on some trophy Kansas whitetails, and they were verv successful.

The youngest of the boys came ever so close to getting a chance at the most well known buck across the Ranch. The oldest of the boys was able to bag his buck on the second evening harvesting his biggest buck to date! The father of the two boys was the last one to get an opportunity at a trophy buck. The buck that stepped out was the same buck that the youngest boy almost had a chance at on the first day of the hunt. The buck we nicknamed "Lefty" was a massive 11 pointer that was well known amongst all the Flint Oak employees. Multiple sheds were found off this buck over the four years of watching him grow. An absolute monster of a Kansas whitetail tipping the scales at over 260 pounds, sporting a 167" rack that only had a 15" spread making for one heck of a trophy.

On the second to last day of the season the youngest Noris boy had an incredible evening in the deer stand. That evening, he and his guide watched over thirty different deer step out of the timber. Twelve or more were bucks. While it was clear to see what buck was ruling the pecking order that sure didn't stop some of the younger bucks from taking out some of their anger on each other. He got to see multiple buck fights throughout the course of the evening. At one point in time there were three different pairs of bucks all fighting at the same time. Just before dark that evening there were three bucks going at it in one group. One doesn't get many deer sits in their life with that much action going on and made for one heck of a memorable hunt.



Oak dogs did a phenomenal job this hunting season and now that they did that many hunts. the spring and summer months are rapidly approaching the kennel staff is switching gears. The blaze orange is getting hung up and the training equipment is getting dusted off. After the grueling season the staff is going

to take some time to get rested before they dive into training.

In the Update last spring there were two litters of pointers talked about and the kennel staff has spent some time during the winter taking them on walks and showing them some pigeons and let's just say that the kennel is going to be taking a big step up in the coming years because those fourteen puppies are very, very nice. The staff is beyond excited to get to honing in on their natural instincts in the training program.

As well as the puppies in the last Spring Update there were some dogs talked about, "Flint Oak Lexi" a female English pointer, "Flint Oak Ann" a female English pointer, "Flint Oak Doc" a male English pointer, and "Flint Oak Lee" a male English setter. All four of those dogs proved that they are going to guide a ton of hunts over the coming years. They all did well over 100 hunts. 100 hunts is crazy, RIght? Well if any of our members or guests

Flint Oak will conduct the 41th annual Hunter Education course on August 12 and 13, 2023 with the help of the Kansas Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism and our local conservation officer. This course consists of outdoor hands on instruction that allows students to become more involved in the learning process. During these sessions, students will be taught history of firearms, firearms basics, ammunition, basic gun safety, hunter responsibility, ethics, and fair chase, field safety and bow hunting. for hunters. The course will run all day on Saturday and half a day on Sunday. After completing the session work, the students will be given a box of shells if they

Flint Oak offers four kinds of hunt memberships. Individual, Corporate (multiple), Junior or Senior.

INDIVIDUAL (Single designee)

Individual Memberships shall be issued in the name of an individual or in the name of a business or firm. Individual Memberships are assigned to one (1) designated individual and are non-transferable. The designee of an Individual Membership will be responsible for any charges incurred by his guests.

CORPORATE (Multiple designees)

Corporate Memberships shall be issued either in the name of a company or an individual associate of a professional group. A company is understood to be any entity holding a Federal Employer Identification Number (FEIN). Such named entity (whether a company or an individual associate) shall be designated as the Owner of the Membership, and the rights and privileges of the Membership are the property of the named Owner. The first Designee appointed by the Owner of the Membership shall be responsible for and billed for all charges incurred by designees and their quests.

Corporate Memberships include membership rights and privileges for three (3) designated individuals. The first Designee shall be Flint Oak's contact for billing purposes. All designees must be directly employed by said company or an associate of the same firm as the Owner of the Membership. Designees may be changed at no charge provided the Owner of the Membership notifies Flint Oak in writing of the substitution.

JUNIOR (Single designee)

Junior Memberships, for those between the ages of twenty-one and forty, require current Hunt Member sponsorship, are assigned to one (1) designated individual and are non-transferable. The designee of a Junior Membership will be responsible for any charges incurred by his guests.

SENIOR (Single designee)

Senior Memberships are available to our current members, who have been a member for the previous five years and are 70 years of age or older. Membership is assigned to one (1) designated individual and is non-transferable. The designee of a Senior Membership will be responsible for any charges incurred by his guests.

Fly Your Company's Flag

Dues and Charges

- 1. Membership dues, regardless of Membership type, shall be paid in advance. Hunt Membership dues will establish membership for one year from the date of acceptance.
- 2. All monthly charges will be due the tenth of the month following the month such charges were incurred.
- 3. Members will be responsible for any charges and/or damages incurred by their quests. Guests will have no billing privileges.
- 4. Members will be billed monthly. Payments to be made by check or ACH payments (no credit cards.)
- 5. Corporate Membership billings will be to one designated Member, and will not be broken down to individual designee charges.
- 6. Hunt credits and/or services included with the initial membership fee must be used during the months of membership. They do not carry over to another membership year, nor are such unused services subject to refund at the conclusion of the membership. Social Memberships receive no hunt credits.

On a Corporate Membership the first Designee or his assigned should collect and forward any moneys paid in order to keep the account accurate. Flint Oak will consider the corporate membership as one account and cannot credit individuals in that account as well as assign hunt credits to individuals in that account. All monies received will be applied to earliest invoices.

The Corporate Membership rate is extended due to the reduction in bookkeeping on one account rather than three individual accounts.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS FISHING REMINDERS

Fishing is April 1st through October 31st. Catch and release only for Bass and Wipers. See fishing rules. During these months fishing for overnight guests and Social Members is at Center Lake, Duck Pond, along the creek and Lodge Lake from the silo to the windsock. Indian Lake is not included. During the month of September fishing lakes may be booked as long as no European or Field Hunts are scheduled in the vicinity.

During fishing season Flint Oak rental boats are permitted on Center Lake. No boats are allowed on Lodge Lake or Timber Lake due to the shot fall from Sporting Clays. We are very concerned about contamination of our water by zebra mussels or other invasive species. Under no circumstances will boats not owned by Flint Oak be allowed on any of the lakes or the creek. No waders allowed. Artificial bait only in the lakes, barbless hooks required
